## Activities:

- Use the enclosed story page to tell the narrative.
- Build a tower out of cardboard bricks, plastic cups, or Duplos. Emphasize that the people forgot were proud of themselves and forgot about God. For this reason, He gave them a consequence.



- Make a 2-D tower using precut paper blocks, torn green paper, and cotton. Older preschoolers can add ramps and ladders with crayons or markers.
- God confused the words of the people so they could not understand each other. Now we speak many different languages. Learn to say "hello" in several different languages.

The Tower of Babel (Genesis 11)

After the flood Noah's family began to fill the world. Because they all spoke the same language, everyone could talk to one another. Some of the family traveled to Babylonia, where they made their home.

One day they decided to build a tall tower. The Tower of Babel would be the tallest tower in the world; then, they thought, everyone would know how smart they were.

God watched the people build the tower higher and higher. It made God very sad. They were not thinking about him at all. The people were thinking only about how great they were.



Because God knew the people had to talk to each other in order to finish the tower, he made the people speak in different languages so they could not understand one another. Once this happened, the people scattered in all directions, and the Tower of Babel was never finished.
