FROM THE
PASTOR'S DESK
Greetings St. Mark!



Forty-two. That's how many new members have joined our family of faith so far in 2024. The Lord continues to do a mighty work in our midst at St. Mark. I assure you, however, that the Lord desires not just more people at St. Mark, but deeper discipleship as well. He desires us all to grow together as His people. In fact, just before going to the cross to bring us back into fellowship with God, our Lord Jesus prayed for us to be one in fellowship with each other in a significant way. In John 17, Jesus prays for "those who will believe" in the message of the disciples. That means you and me! Here is what Jesus prayed for us: "That they may all be one, just as you, Father, are in me, and I in you, that they also may be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me. The glory that you have given me I have given to them, that they may be one even as we are one, I in them and you in me, that they may become perfectly one, so that the world may know that you sent me and loved them even as you loved me."

Simply put: we cannot experience the full love and glory of God in our lives that Jesus died to give us if we neglect to make our fellowship together as disciples a top priority. The challenge to this is not only the frantic nature or our lives – busying ourselves with too many things that distract and pull us away from the most important and eternal matters – but also our tendency to want to privatize our faith. Maybe out of fear, maybe out of selfishness, or maybe out of complacency, many today think it best to keep our faith in Jesus a private matter. This is not, however, what Jesus desires nor what He prayed for!

I would like to share with you the words of author Jen Oshman, taken from her book entitled Enough About Me. I think Jen's evaluation of our current Christian culture is accurate, and a large reason why we are seeing such a disturbing decline in the church in America; not just in numbers, but more troublesome, in discipleship. We are declining in large part because we have sought to privatize our faith and our relationship with the Lord. Here is what Jen said in her book:

I think what we have seen in the church over the last several decades—maybe the last few generations—is a prioritization of our faith being personal. This is good and right. However, as we've prioritized that personal relationship, we've also privatized it.

We've said, "Your relationship with the Lord is yours. It's private. There's nothing corporate about it. 'You do you,' even in your relationship with Jesus." We've turned Scripture into this book full of sayings for me and what the Bible has for me to today; and then we've turned the church into a place we go as a consumer of what we want instead of asking the Lord, "God, how can I serve you?" Instead, we say, "God, how can you serve me? How is the church going to serve me? How is the Bible going to serve me? What can I get out of my relationship with the Lord?"

That's not how Scripture is written, and that's not how the church is meant to function. While the church's prioritization on us having a personal faith is good, it has gone awry. It's become counterfeit over time and we've made what should be personal into something private. It was never meant to be private.

Jen's right, isn't she? Privatizing our faith so that we can live more like we want to live and not be accountable to God through our accountability to His people will not bring us the joy we are seeking. What will bring us that true joy? The Apostle John said it clearly in 1 John 1:3–4, "That which we have seen and heard we proclaim also to you, so that you too may have fellowship with us; and indeed our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son Jesus Christ. And we are writing these things so that our joy may be complete."

St. Mark's new Midweek Ministry offers us all the opportunity to experience just that. The chance for us to be complete in the joy of the Lord, to achieve the deep and meaningful Christian relationships we all long for, and that the Lord desires us to have, and that He has promised to work through to bring us the fullness of His love in our lives today. Many members of our church have already been working hard in the background to ensure our Midweek Ministry proves to be an invaluable opportunity to be complete in our joy together and satisfied with food for the body and soul!

Sarah, Lizzy, Jesse, Hezekiah, and I will be there looking forward to the joy of our fellowship together. I pray that you will heed our Lord's prayer for our unity together in His grace as a church and family of faith.


VOLUNTEER AS A SUNDAY SCHOOL TEACHER!
